KNOW THE BASICS

Scholarships cover college costs without debt. Unlike loans, scholarships don't need to be paid back.



MERIT AID

is a type of financial aid available for college students that is awarded by the school based on academic, athletic, artistic, leadership, or special-interest merit without considering their financial need.



NEED-BASED AID

Need-based scholarships and grants are awarded on financial need alone. These can be awarded by the school or your state or federal government. Most, if not all, need-based aid requires the submission of FAFSA.

GET SMART ABOUT SEARCHING

- You can find one or two scholarships that match your qualifications by visiting rischolarships.org. Searching for local scholarships can be less competitive than national ones.
- HS Guidance should be able to provide you with a list of scholarships specific to your graduating class.

REACH OUT TO WHO YOU KNOW

Speak to your parents, teachers, and family friends. They might know of a scholarship that could suit you, such as one offered by their employer, a local organization, or a memorial scholarship in your local area.

MEET YOUR DEADLINES

Submit your scholarship applications early or on time to increase your chances of being considered. Many organizations don't accept late entries. This is a critical step in the process.
